- Always ensure adequate ventilation of the work area to avoid the formation of a combustible mixture of flying dust and air. Always punch down or remove all nails, screws, tacks and other fixings from the floor before sanding to prevent contact with the sanding drum, causing sparks. Never smoke when using or servicing the floor sander or when handling the dust bag.

Key Operating Instructions

- 1. Clear the area to be sanded of all obstacles and ensure that all nails are punched down below the surface.
- 2. Ensure that the machine is disconnected from the electrical supply.
- 3. Fit an abrasive sheet and dust bag tightly following the instruction in the operators manual.
- 4. Connect the electrical supply. If an extension lead is required use only a heavy duty lead of 15AMP+ .Position the power cable over one shoulder, tilt the machine back to lift the sanding drum from the floor, and start the machine by pressing the 'I' button (on).
- 5. Start to move forward and lower the drum onto the floor by tilting forwards allowing the sander to cut under its own weight and keeping the forward speed as constant as possible. At the end of the forward movement tilt the machine back to lift the drum from the floor before you stop moving. Repeat the same instructions moving backwards to complete the first pass.
- 6. Position the machine around 7" (180mm) to one side of the previous pass and then repeat the above instructions.
 - Do not allow the 'running' machine to remain in one place with the drum in contact with the floor, as this will cause an uneven surface finish.
- 7. To switch the machine off press the '0' button and wait for the drum to stop revolving before tilting the machine forward to rest on the drum.

Disconnect from the power supply when changing the abrasive paper, servicing the floor sander, replacing the dust bag or leaving the machine unattended. Never leave the machine unattended with a dust bag fitted that has been used. Remove it and dispose of the dust safely in a suitable container.
